## SERMON INTRODUCTION

In Cleveland, Ohio, it is illegal for a married woman to get a haircut without permission from her husband. According to state law, a wife's hair belongs to her spouse, so she needs his permission before altering it. In Alabama, it is a capital offense to spread salt on railroad tracks. Apparently, salt was used to melt frozen mud so that trains could pass more easily. The problem was that the salt also attracted cattle which, when hit by a train, caused major accidents.

What do these two laws have in common? They both have outlived their usefulness. They were written for a time that no longer exists. Today, a woman's hair belongs solely to herself, and Alabama no longer has enough cattle to worry about their wandering onto the railroad tracks. Some group God's laws into the same category as these two laws—outdated, backwards regulations that are no longer useful to our day and age.

So, are God's laws archaic policies or are they ageless principles? Join Pastor Randy and me for the next two series—*The Two* and *The Ten*—as we will discover the relevance of God's law for our lives.
